

HON. TIMOTHY R. WALSH, '91

Judge Timothy R. Walsh is the Supervising Judge of the Criminal Division for the San Diego County Superior Court. He became a Superior Court Judge in 2005. He was formerly Deputy District Attorney for the County of San Diego District Attorney's Office. Judge Walsh was with the County of San Diego District Attorney's Office as a Deputy District Attorney for over 12 years where he served in a variety of capacities, one of which was as trial team leader in the South Bay Office. Judge Walsh is a frequent lecturer and former adjunct professor at the University of San Diego School of Law where he has taught Advanced Trial Advocacy. He is also a professor of business and criminal justice at the University of Phoenix. Judge Walsh's experience includes two years as an associate with the Reardon Law Firm. He is a regularly invited local and national public speaker on a variety of legal topics, most often on the topic of drug facilitated rape.

In 2000, Judge Walsh received San Diego County's Sexual Assault Response Teams Annual Award for a Prosecutor and in an office of over 300 career prosecutors was named Prosecutor of the Year 2000 by the San Diego County Deputy District Attorney Association. He is a member of the San Diego District Attorneys Association and the California District Attorneys Association and is former president of the Pacific Beach Town Council.

From 1986 to 1988, Judge Walsh served on active duty in the U.S. Navy. From 1988 until 2008 he served in the Navy reserves until his retirement with over 20 years of Active and Reserve Service in 2008. He retired as a Commander after serving as the Commanding Officer of several reserve Units..

Judge Walsh graduated from University of San Diego School of Law in 1991. He is a graduate of The College of the Holy Cross in Worcester, Mass., where he received his bachelor's degree in economics in 1986. He joined the Law Alumni Association Board of Directors in the 1995-1996 academic year.
